## Pentecost- May 19, 2024

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

#### 



Pentecost Sunday marks not the "end", but the "fulfillment" of the Easter season. We have taken time to reflect on our need for renewal and forgiveness, we have meditated on the love of God made manifest in the Cross of Christ. We have been witnesses to the power of his Resurrection as force that binds the Church together in its members and in its mission. We have been promised the power of his Spirit to speak to others in the power of his name, being ministers of divine mercy and life to a world in need of renewal. It is this Spirit which sustains, protects, inspires, and empowers the Church on Earth until his kingdom is realized in its fullness. Thus we live in what can be reckoned as the "end-times"... the final epoch anticipating the coming of a new and eternal Jerusalem. On that day the Church, purified from sin and made holy by her Redeemer will be as

radiant as a bride, coming to meet her bridegroom.

What is our response to this time of grace? It is the Spirit who groans within us, giving words to the unspeakable depths of our souls before the glory of God. Today we welcome again the coming of the Spirit, first given to us in Baptism, stirred up in us at Confirmation, and nourished by each Eucharist. Each prayer and act of worship, each good intention and inspiration, every act of faith, hope, and love are opportunities to grow in the works fo the Holy Spirit in our midst. Our response is one of eagerness to do his work and live in the power of his grace, putting aside the slumber of souls enveloped in darkness and indifference. This has been the 'reason for the season' which shall sustain us in the year of grace before us.

During the Lent and Easter seasons, Mass has been celebrated at **6pm on Wednesday** nights, in order to provide an additional opportunity for parishioners to attend daily Mass during the week. It has been decided to continue the Wednesday 6pm Mass at St. Anthony's through the summer season. There will be no Wednesday evening Mass on May 22, 29 or June 5 due to other events on these dates, but Wednesday evening Masses will resume and run from June 12 and running until August 7.




An RCIA/OCIA group is being formed at St. Anthony for the Summer of 2024! We had five people express interest in becoming Catholic at an organizational meeting on May 13, so we will meet again on Monday, May 20 to continue the journey and try to set a mutually-agreeable time to meet going through the summer. The "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults"

is the framework by which the Catholic Church provides formation and catechesis for its new members, leading to the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist). Not only would we welcome those interested in becoming Catholic, but also we welcome those who missed one or more of

**Monday, May 27** will be the Memorial Day Mass at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00. In the event of rain, we will divert to St. Anthony's at 9:30 am.
