Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 2, 2024

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The celebration of Corpus Christi was established in the midthirteenth century in response to diminished veneration of the Eucharist throughout the Church and the proliferation of Eucharistic heresies during the late Middle-Ages. The origin of the feast is found in two miracle stories. The first is that of St. Juliana of Cornillon who had a vision of the Church, appearing as the full moon, but with a darkened spot on its surface. She heard a gentle locution explaining that the spot symbolized the fact that in all of the great celebrations of the Church year, a feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament was missing. She sought spiritual direction from Bishop Robert de Thorete, the Bishop of Liege, who was moved to hold a synod and establish such a feast in his diocese, starting in 1247. It is reported that she had also spoken with a Fr. Jacques Pantaleon, a priest of the diocese of Lyon, who would become Pope Urban IV (1261-1264).

The second miracle is that of Fr. Pietro de Praga, a German priest whose love of the Eucharist had grown cold due to doubts as to whether the Eucharist could really be the Body and Blood of Our Lord. In 1263, while celebrating Mass at Santa Christina in Bolsena, at the breaking of the Bread, blood flowed from sacred host, covering the altar cloth, the corporal, and the floor. Pope Urban IV, in residence just miles away at Orvieto, commanded that the altar cloths be brought to him, that he could witness what had happened. These relics remain at the Cathedral in Orvieto to this day.

Moved by this miracle and the testimony of St. Juliana, Pope Urban IV published a bull, Transiturus de hoc mundo, ("As he was about to pass from this world"") reflecting on the institution of

the Eucharist on Holy Thursday. In this bull, he promulgated today's feast in honor of the Eucharist—the first feast to be added to the universal calendar by papal decree in this manner.

There had been a number of theologians who had written of their doubts of the Eucharist, and satisfaction with a 'merely symbolic' understanding of what the Eucharist meant. And while this might seem a reasonable philosophical compromise with what is perceived by natural human senses, this position shies away from the perennial orthodoxy of Christ being truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine... what we understand as the "Real Presence" of the Eucharist. While, yes, the Eucharist is a symbol, it is not a symbol that points to a reality outside of itself. The Eucharist is, by God's power and plan, the true perpetuation of Jesus' divine presence in the world for all time, until the consummation of the world.

As that one song says, we do NOT "look beyond the bread we eat"... rather, it is in diving deeply into the true reality of the Eucharist that we find not mere bread, simply transformed as if by 'slight of hand' by naming it 'Jesus' or using it to represent Jesus, or even using it as a device to remember Holy Thursday. We recognize the Eucharist as the true, divine presence of God! If the Eucharist were not God, then we Catholics are quilty of pitiful idolatry. If it is what Jesus says it is, his body and blood, then the whole world must bend the knee at his divine presence.

St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), an eminent theologian of the day, was commissioned to write the Mass texts for the new feast—texts which appear in our Missals today. To go with those Mass texts, he wrote the words to a hymn, which speaks tenderly of the frail limitations of human perception, the grace of the incarnation to make us witnesses of Christ and his saving deeds, and the final triumph of faith when we are able to recognize our Lord "in the breaking of the bread".

Sing, my tongue the Savior's Glory! Of His Flesh, the mystery sing; Of the Blood, all price exceeding, Shed by our Immortal King, Destined for the world's redemption. From a noble Womb to spring.

Word-made-Flesh, the bread of nature By his Word to Flesh He turns; Wine into His Blood he changes What through sense no change discerns Newer rites of grace prevail: Only be the heart in earnest, Faith her lesson quickly learns.

Of a pure and spotless Virgin Born for us on earth below, He, as Man, with man conversing Stayed, the seeds of truth to sow: Then He closed in solemn order Wondrously His life of woe.

Down in adoration falling. Lo, the sacred Host we hail, Lo, o'er ancient forms departing Faith for all defects supplying, When the feeble senses fail.

On the night of that Last Supper. Seated with his chosen band, He, the Pascal Victim eating, First fulfils the Law's command: Then as Food to all his brethren Gives Himself with his own Hand.

To the everlasting Father And the Son who comes on high With the Holy Ghost proceeding Forth from each eternally, Be salvation, honor, blessing. Might and endless majesty. Amen.
