

"What shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it?" (Mk 4: 30) The Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed that when sown, grows into one of the largest of plants, so that like the great cedars (see Ez 17: 23 from the first reading), the birds of the sky may dwell there.

The investment seems so small, but the point of the parable is that large results can come from small beginnings. Consider human development from a single cell to a fullgrown adult. Consider weekly contributions made to a retirement account over the course of a person's career. Consider the witness of a single patriot or martyr against tyranny of a corrupt government. Consider the first step of one who is suffering from an addiction as they take the first step across the threshold for treatment; the sinner who wants to change themselves, summons the courage to confess their sins, and

changes their way. If great results can come from small actions, what does that say of the dignity of the small 'seed'? The seed is worth infinitely more than its small stature... it is a package that contains the potential of a glorious future, if planted, protected, nurtured, and nourished.

The parable speaks of faith being as a seed that grows into the great tree. How often do we recognize "promptings of the spirit"—those small inspirations to bring about some good in the world, such as a compliment to someone we encounter, generosity to someone in need, correction to someone in error, patience with someone that we struggle with, the inspiration to prayer? These small promptings which arise in our hearts and consciences have no substance in themselves until they are activated... when desire of the human will leads to action and then action becomes reality. We cannot possibly respond to all of the passing thoughts that we consider, but as we learn to discern that breath of the Sprit moving within us and how to respond, we learn how to become fruitful beyond all imagining.



When I was ordained fifty years ago I never envisioned that I would make it for fifty years! (Two classmates from the Diocese that same year have since deceased.)

I cannot imagine a nicer reception than the one the ladies if the parish and the Knights of Columbus hosted in the Parish Hall on May 25th for my 50th. Thank you for a beautiful evening! — Fr. Don
