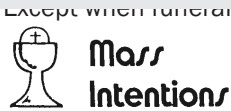

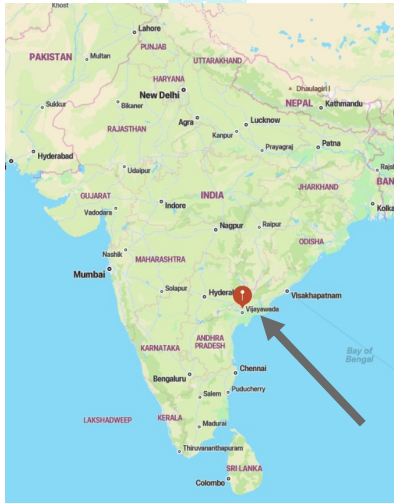

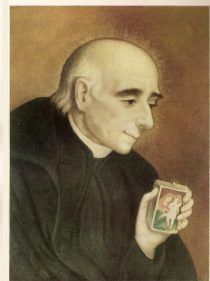

This weekend we welcome Fr. Balaji Boyalla, SAC of the Gloria Dei region of the Society of the Catholic Apostolate ("SAC"), the Pallottines, based in Vijayawada, India, and serving throughout the world. "Fr. B." comes to us from his current parish assignment in Texas. Each year, in cooperation with the Office for the Missions at the Diocese of Springfield, a missionary society is assigned to each parish to not only present an appeal for support by the people, but to inform our parishioners about the missionary work that takes place throughout the work in their name and in the name of the Church. I invite you to consider supporting the work presented this weekend and to join Fr. B. and the Pallottine priests of India and throughout the world in prayerful support of the poor and needy throughout the world.

Fr B. writes, "The Gloria Dei Region uses funds collected from the mission appeals to care for the disabled, the elderly, and the sick, to provide homes for the poor and for abandoned children, manage schools and educational institutions in rural areas in developing countries, and promote pastoral formation of our missionaries related to human, intellectual, and spiritual development. The collected funds will be used for the day-to-day support for missionaries, to supply material goods, to finish projects, and to meet the basic needs in rural areas where we work. The children, the elderly, the sick, the poor, the abandoned, the handicapped, and the suffering will benefit from these funds. Your support funds the basic needs—such as food and medicine, pastoral works,

vehicles to arrive to remote rural areas where there are no roads, to build seminaries and churches to provide hope where the Catholic faith is a minority or does not exist at all for the enrichment of the evangelization program throughout the world. Your positive response will support our work in the missions where our Pallottine priests are working."

The Pallottines are founded by St. Vincent Pallotti (1795-1850). Vincent was the third of ten children, who grew up going to daily Mass. Following his calling to serve God, he was ordained a priest in 1818. Vincent believed that all (laity, clergy, and religious) are called to be apostles. His dream was to enable lay people to assume their proper role in the mission of the Church and establish a community to translate this vision into reality.

Ahead of its time as a mission society within the Church, the "Union of the Catholic Apostolate", to include lay, clergy, and religious members, was formally approved in 1835 by Pope Gregory XVI. In many ways the inclusive structure of this new society anticipated the "Universal Call to Holiness" taught by the Second Vatican Council. Vincent was beatified in 1950 by Pope Pius XII and canonized in 1963 by Pope John XXIII. St. Vincent Pallotti is recognized as a patron to the Pontifical Missionary Union of Clergy and of the Second Vatican Council, itself. His incorrupt body is enshrined in the church of San Salvatore in Onda in Rome.

GLORIA DEI PALLOTTINES MISSION APPEAL

At the coming weekend liturgies, a Pallottine priest, will be here to speak about the missionary work of the Pallottines in India. The congregation, of the Pallottine Fathers and Brothers, is present in 50 countries all over the world. In India, Pallottines have been involved in the work of evangelization for the last 65 years. The Pallottines work in partnership with laity throughout the world furthering the church's mission to renew faith and rekindle love. The help and support of many generous people all over the world, makes it possible to continue God's work. Your own efforts to support the Missions all over the world are greatly appreciated.
