A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:




Paul closes his Second Letter of the Corinthians with a testimony to God's work in his life. Paul is obviously a bright man, he was able to convince many people of the Good News of Christ through his preaching and he was one of the few in society who could write But he relizes that his success is not about him or the work that he did... it is not because of his strength or wisdom or courage... it is *in spite of himself* that he has been successful.

He writes somewhat cryptically of a "thorn in the

flesh" that was given to him. Do we know what that was? Some scripture scholars suggest he might have had a speech impediment. Still others think he was going blind or might have had epilepsy. Still others propose that it was some history of sin in his life, which would be apparent by the way he hunted down Christians for persecution before his conversion. We don't exactly know what Paul was referring to, but in any case, Paul points to God's grace, which has been 'enough' for him.

Paul's testimony is no gesture of false humility, nor is it a sign of anxiety over his limitations and failures. God has been faithful to him throughout his apostolic ministry, even in times of 'weakness, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints'. Indeed, he recognizes that when he was week, that is when God's strength was most evident in him.
