A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Jesus chose twelve men from among all of his followers to be his special co-workers, whom we identify as apostles. Of this group, we knew that a few of them were fishermen, another was a tax collector. We don't know anything about the rest. These men were not particularly talented or successful as the world would see them. We probably would have never heard of any of them, had they not followed Jesus. But somehow as they witnessed the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord, they were transformed inwardly to



become the evangelizers of a faith that would go throughout the entire known world. If we were to form a team of twelve people to build a house, who would you choose? Probably we'd have someone with knowledge of architecture and engineering. We would want someone with expertise in concrete and someone else who knows carpentry. A plumber and an electrician would be helpful. Let's add a person or two who can do drywall, and hopefully there would be someone with interior decorating and landscaping experience to finish out the house... and so on, until the team was built. Even if we don't personally have the experience or expertise to build this house, most of us would have the foresight to understand what kind of skills and talents would be necessary to complete the job.

When Jesus walked the earth, he could have chosen anyone to join him... a spokesperson, a politician, a doctor, a lawyer, a particle physicist, his mom, a bodyguard. He chose these twelve simple men. Didn't he understand how difficult the mission of evangelization would be? Of course he did, but most importantly, he knew the hearts of these apostles—not what they could do for him or what they could provide for the apostolic team, but who they were deep within... even Judas his betrayer. When Jesus formed his apostolic squad, his standard was *who* they are, not *what* they are.

And then he goes on and tells his disciples, don't pack food or a money bag. You don't need a second tunic. You have everything you need. Go and preach where you find acceptance for great power will accompany you. Come back later and tell us what you see and do. There is a time for worry and a time for careful preparation and planning, but this is a time for faith. The Word carried by the Twelve would be powerful; it would speak for itself. That Word calls down glory, not to you or even your mission, but to God himself... to the praise of *his* glory. These Twelve who heard the call were to bring the Good News to the world... and so it goes in the Church even today.


