A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

This is one of our premeire events through the year, having going back with a history of more than 100 years, which unites us as a parish family. Thanks to all who have come out, all who worked throughout the week to setup and tear-down. Thank you to our sponsors, donors, and benefactors. Thanks to all who are working the stands and concessions and activities. A special thanks goes out to our chairpeople who have been organizing this event throughout the year, and who will be thinking about the 2025 Junefest and St. Anthony Picnic not long after this years' festivals are in the history books.



"Setting the Table"... Our reading of the sixth chapter of the Gospel of Mark ends this weekend, preparing for the next six weeks' readings from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, where Jesus proclaims, "I am the Bread of Life." (John 6:35) In the next verses of Mark 6, we were to hear the story of the feeding of the 5,000, but the Gospel of John tells the story and then pauses to meditate on the meaning of that miraculous day at some length. The Church invites into that meditation by presenting the sixth chapter of John over six weeks, allowing us to see ourselves as the hungry, lost sheep from today's Gospel. "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest with me for a while." (Mark 6: 31) Everyone reading this bulletin should have a bible at home; I invite you to re-read the sixth chapter of John during the coming week. The Lord has an important message for us all, if we slow down and come away with him for a little while.

This weekend, nearly 50,000 have gathered for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. This is the culmination of years of planning, which ultimately is targeted at inviting the entire Church to renew its devotion to the Holy Eucharist. While this event is taking place hours from here, we are all united in spirit through the Eucha-

rist we share. Heaven and earth are joined each time we call upon the presence of or Lord at Mass. He wishes to feed us with his own flesh as we recognize him as Lord. God is not a far-away reality, but one who speaks to the hunger of our souls inviting us to eat, drink, and live!
