
A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

In the days of King Ahab, altars and temples were built in honor of 'Baal', an important deity of the Canaanites. Peace through cultural tolerance reigned by accommodating this alternate form of worship in the kingdom, but the Lord God was offended by the idolatry of his people. He thus sent Elijah to prophesy to King Ahab that the land would face famine and destruction unless the nation returned to the One, True God. Ahab became furious with Elijah, so much so that he was warned by the King's wife that he must flee for his life. In the midst of his flight, he looked upon his misfortune and called out to God, praying, "Enough Lord! Take my life, for I am no better than



my ancestors." The Angel of the Lord was sent to Elijah, and told him, "Get up and eat!" for the journey ahead would be a long one. Elijah questioned how this could be an answer to his prayer for death? But he got up, ate bread and drank water set out for him and, strengthened by the food, he traveled for forty days and nights to encounter God at Horeb.

The Holy Eucharist is sometimes called Viaticum, meaning "food for the journey", particularly when received near the time of death. This 'food' is none other than the Lord's own presence and loving assistance. It provides spiritual sustenance in time of great need, not unlike the distress suffered by Elijah the Prophet, and comes to us each time we receive the Eucharist at Mass.



the ancient Church and rooted in scriptural revelation.

Having been preserved from sin from the very moment of her conception ("the Immaculate Conception"), Mary had perfect sanctifying grace within her soul, equipping her to be the Mother of our Lord. Thus, Mary's perfect "yes" to God, strengthened by a unique gift of grace given her, would permit the Word to become Flesh to live within her and dwell among us. As a further consequence of her specially-favored status (being "full of grace"), Mary's passing from this world is also unique. While pious opinions can be argued on both sides whether she suffered a bodily death or not, the Church infallibly teaches that Mary from all time shared in the realized merit of the Cross of her Son, and thus avoids any corruption of her body in death. In the Eastern Church, they call this the feast of the "Dormition of Mary"... her 'falling asleep', after which her body was carried up, incorrupt, into the glory of heaven. In any case, this is a special privilege belonging to the Mother of God, which returns humanity to its preternatural state before the sin of our first parents, prefiguring the glory we all await in the Resurrection of the Dead.

And so, what this solemnity calls to mind that It is the same glory shared by Mary is promised to the Church. Thus, this feast is not only an opportunity to venerate Mary as the first of the Saints of Heaven, but it is also an opportunity to recommit ourselves to Christian Virtue which perfects the gifts of God within us and prepares us to share in the eternal glory of his Kingdom.

Mass for the Solemnity will be at 4:00 pm on Wednesday, August 14 (vigil) and on Thursday August 15 at 7:30 am and 6:30 pm, all at St. Anthony. Mass will also be held at St. Dominic at 8:30 am and at Good Samaritan Home at 10:00 am on Thursday.


The Springfield Diocesan Council Of Catholic Women are excited to announce their upcoming convention on Wednesday, August 28 th , at Lake Williamson Retreat


