A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Jesus distinguishes between the external acts of religion and the internal effects of faith, as he explains to his disciples that the external acts of cleansing of hands, cups and jugs and kettles and beds are not what make a person clean. It is the attitudes from within that lead to holiness. Clinging to human tradition does not lead to salvation, but rather one must be spiritually washed clean of the pollution that comes out of the human heart: evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. These attitudes and actions help us see religion not as a mere 'good habit' to be followed, like washing hands before dinner, but it is an invitation to deeper cleansing and reformation. "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourself." (Jm 1: 22)



As the Pastoral and Finance Councils, in concert with the Buildings and Grounds crew of the Men's Society, continue to discuss our needs in anticipation of our participation in the Diocesan Centennial Campaign, we have had a structural engineer examine our church based on concerns which have been casually noted over the years. Of particular concern is the condition of the external walls of the church to the left and the right of the sanctuary/altar, as the building standards of the 1980's, when St. Anthony Church was built, were not nearly as, ahem, 'comprehensive' as they are today. When one looks along the back of the wall, one can notice places where the mortar has popped and bricks have spalled, where wire holding the layers of the wall are exposed and corroding, where there is noticeable bowing (on the order of an inch or so) along the true plane of the walls, and finally where signs of water infiltration are evident. Many of these defects have been present for some time, perhaps even at the time of the original construction. Our situation is not immediately urgent, but for the good of the long term (50+ year) health and cost-effective maintenance of our church building, our engineer is developing a plan to consider, which may be a featured 'need' for fundraising in the upcoming "Centennial Campaign" that the Diocese of Springfield is calling for.

More emergent, however, is the situation in the 'tower' of the church. As you may know, the church tower was originally built some 30 feet taller, as I am told by parish lore, to allow the cross to be visible from I-172 over the trees. A noble design! But sometime shortly after the original building, it was discovered that the aerodynamic forces of winds striking the tower were causing damage to the underlying brick-work (see illustration where a 1/2+ inch gap is present, below). Sometime shortly after the original construction, the tower was taken off and reduced by those 30-ish feet and has been 'watched' for all of these years since by the men of the parish.



Over the years, winds have continued to exert forces on the tower. It is the judgement of our structural engineer, with the approval and recommendation of the Buildings and Grounds unit at the Diocese of Springfield, that the tower should be removed for the time being, until such time that we can remediate the damage and discern a different way to honor the cross. I am asking a local engineering firm to draw up some concept art of what alternate designs might look like for us all to consider at a future time.

I write today in anticipation of offering additional explanations at Sunday Mass over coming weeks.

We are planning to do the tower work sometime soon— this fall. I will do my best to keep you informed of the progress of these projects, and I thank you all for your support of all that we do at St. Anthony Church & St. Dominic School to maintain our buildings and grounds!
