A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Supposedly, the 16th century Reformation of the Christian Church hinged on studies of the passage we hear today from the Epistle of James. "What good is it, my brothers, to profess faith without practicing it? Such faith has no power to save!" (James 2:14) In the dark days leading up to the fracture of the Catholic Church in the West, I think that any objective witness could affirm that the Church had lost her way, preaching the faith but straying far from living it. The Catholic-Protestant polemics of the centuries that followed tended to deteriorate into name-calling; the Catholic Church was characterized as seeing salvation exclusively through good works... if a person were just good enough, they might

'earn' the reward of eternal life. On the other hand, Protestants were characterized as seeing salvation through 'imputed grace'... a grace that is simply applied to the 'credit' of the receiver without necessarily requiring one to live a life of conversion, to include sacrifice and good works. Of course, both extremes are incorrect and do not accurately reflect either the teachings of either the Catholic Church or Reformation Protestantism.

There is an authentic 'faith-and-works' reality which must be lived. James argues as much when he concludes, "you must perceive that a person is justified by his [faith-filled (c.f. James 2:18)] works, and not by faith alone" (James 2:24). We are saved by faith that is totally free for the asking, but a faith that also must be put into action by a life of conversion.

Today's Gospel deepens our consideration of the faith-works dynamic. Peter is asked "who do you say that I am?" Peter declares "you are the Messiah!" (Mark 8: 29) In the other Gospels, Jesus affirms this insight as a sign of Peter's faith. But then Jesus goes on to teach Peter and the disciples that the mystery does not and cannot stop there. It is not enough to simply know the 'secret' that Jesus is the Messiah, but now each of his followers is commanded to 'deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me', (Mark 8: 34) You recognize and proclaim me as Lord. Good. Now go do something about it that makes a difference!



QUINCY CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

We had a spirited discussion about the "working plan" for our Quincy Catholic Schools this week. We are continuing to make efforts to cooperate with a centralized system of administration, curriculum, and budget, and as part of that plan, the bishop has mandated that we are come up with a 'facilities plan', that is, a plan on how we are going to align our facilities in this new organizatio to support the mission of forming new generations of disciples to our Lord Jesus Christ now and in the future. As part of this plan, we are proposing to set up a middle-school structure, allowing us to localize our resources in one building, which at this time is designated as St. Peter's, which then is further fed by a Grade 1-4 facility and pre-K through Kindergarten facilities in our community, allowing us to enroll more students from the un-

derserved segment of our community which requires early childhood daycare and services. This is not a done deal, but one that requires the continued study and comment of all involved. I ask our parishioners to become informed about this plan and to offer comments to the Quincy Catholic Schools at Feedback@quincycatholicschools.org.

St. Francis School GOLF OUTING The Holy Name Society is sponsoring a golf outing to raise money for St. Francis School.


