A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

It is an interesting Gospel we are presented with today, as the Disciples are traveling to Capernaum. Once inside the house, Jesus calls them out, "What were you arguing about along the way?" At once the Twelve fell silent. I would take it as a sign of shame before the Lord, not wanting to embar-rass themselves. They were arguing about who was the greatest among them. In other words, they were discussing the 'seating arrangements in heaven'... how high each one of them would be as they sit along with the Lord in glory.

Jesus would use this moment to teach his disciples that greatness is not achieved by power or influence, but rather by the ability of one to lower oneself and become 'the last' and 'servant of all'. After all, Jesus came down from heav-en, placing his divinity and his humanity at service to all who would call upon him. His condescension... his lowering himself to become a servant of all... would not be unlike a grown man or woman taking to heart the confidences and needs of little children who are vulnerable, innocent, and powerless in society.

But then Jesus turns around the saying and makes it even more intense. It is not about putting aside even divine power to serve the helpless, but it is finding that in serv-ing the helpless and the child-like, ("whoever receives on child such as this in my name...") we actually have something to receive from them ("... receives me.") Humility becomes a virtue that not only clears our eyes from the fog of our own 'power', but it also helps us to receive more readily the secrets hidden in small packages. Humility is a virtue with dual practice, of not only giving away our illusions of our sophistication and power, but of being patient and receptive to see the glory of the "little ways" among us.

A Message from Father Don Blickhan:

We are about a month from our national elections, seeking to fill public offices from the local to the national level. To vote is oru great privilege— and our sacred duty.

And our vote matters.

A friend, Mecki Kosin, a native of Germany, once shared with me that there was a national election in her homeland in 1934. Only 17 percent of those eligible to vote went to the polls. Adolph Hitler won by a narrow margin—and world history was forever changed! Scary!



Your vote matters!

For your vote to matter however, we would be wise to remember that

1. This election is not about personalities. Whether or not you like a candidate is irrelevant. The question is whether the individual can do the job. Some of the best leaders that I have observed were not "nice" guys. But they got the job done. A wise voter is not looking for a friend or for a nice person, but for a leader.

2. This election is about issues, many of which are moral. When you elect a person, you select his platform. It is wide therefore to study the candidate's positions and past record. Some politicians can be chameleons. Listen not so much to what they say, but what they have done.

3. As Catholics we are wise to ask ourselves: "Does the candidate's platform conform to Catholic truth?" Catholic Doctrine echoes the very heart of our Faith, the teachings of Jesus Christ. It is about integrity. If you do not stand with the Lord, how can you call yourself a Catholic?

4. Have you studied the issues? That requires research, which is a lot of work. And be aware that much of what you hear from the news media is propaganda—and not fact. If you do not understand the issues, are you then not failing in your moral duty as a citizen? And those that not mean that you have failed yourself, your family, and your country? Elections have consequences.


2024 Life Chain
