A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Our readings this week reflect on the nature and aims of Christian Marriage. Essential to the celebration of marriage is the presumption that a husband and wife are freely committing themselves to a union that will be faithful, fruitful, and final. This is a tall order for a world that values individual liberty, self-actualization, and self-expression above loyalty to others and personal sacrifice. In our own time, it is typical to embrace the false virtue of keeping one's options 'open' for the inevitable eventualities of life, rather than embracing a complete and final commitment as one does in marriage.

The Church jealously defends the marriage bond, and expects the faithful who have entered into marriage to honor those vows unto death, after the teaching of our Lord. Quoting Genesis, Jesus remarks, "... a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. (Gen 2:24) So they are no longer two, but

one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, no human being must separate" (Mark 10: 7-9). Further, the union of man and woman in the sacrament of marriage becomes an icon, a living symbol, of the union of Christ and his Church. As Christ lays down his life for the Church and as the Church becomes ever more perfect in obedience to the Lord, so the union of God and his people are perfected (see Ephesians 5:22ff). Once again, this is a hard saying in a society that considers marriage primarily a pathway to self-realization and satisfaction, rather than as a union of self-sacrificing love. Jesus remarks that the allowance of divorce in Mosaic law is not part of God's plan, but is a concession to the 'hardness of your hearts'.

This opens for our consideration this week, those in our own time who find themselves in irregular marital situations following divorce or separation from a marriage. The Church recognizes that sometimes this is necessary for the physical and spiritual protection of spouses and families, but at the same time will guard the integrity of the matrimonial bond and the necessity for partners to practice heroic virtue in mutual forgiveness, reformation, and renewal, even in difficult situations. The process of examining marriages for signs of nullity is not simply an allowanc of "Catholic divorce", but is a work of justice that parties may enjoy the benefits of an authentic Christian marriagewhere a prior attempted-union lacked that perfection before. For those who have suffered divorce, the Church desires to reach out to you for healing where possible, which usually requires starting a conversation with a pastor or another trusted minister who can help parties find out what services and accommodations may be available.



It is time to identify candidates who would be interested in becoming Catholic by way of the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**. How do we get new Catholics to join the Church? We must personally welcome them and mentor them in the faith! Is this the year for your spouse? Your son/daughter-in-law? Your parent(s)? Your neighbor or colleague at work? We would like to get to know them and help them to get to know the Church. Please contact Fr. Tom at the par-

ish office for more information and to get started on the adventure of becoming Catholic! We are planning an organizational meeting for new inquirers soon.

Relationship Health Survey



The Tracy Family is helping us partner with an organization called Communio – a nonprofit ministry that equips parishes with outreach tools and ministry strategies to grow and draw more souls to Christ through evangelization and discipleship of marriages and relationships. Communio is helping us set some ambitious multi-year Mission Outcomes and create a strategic plan to achieve them. So, you can expect to see some exciting new things here at the parish over the coming weeks, including:

- Enhancing existing ministry and developing a new series of events and experiences that build up community and friendships within our church and with those in our community.
- Using new forms of digital and mail outreach to invite people not already connected to our parish to our new ministry experiences.
- Implementing new skills-based ministries that help people in all stages of romantic life whether you're single, dating, engaged or married to strengthen their relationships.

The questions in the survey were developed by academic experts in the field of relationship education and health studies.
