



"The Lord has done great things for us, we are filled with joy!" Psalm 126 follows our reading from the prophet Jeremiah today. Jeremiah longs for that joyous day when the 'ruminant of Israel' would be released from their captivity in the North. The psalm speaks of "when the Lord brought us back, we were like men dreaming". The captivity Jerimiah and the psalmist speaks of is the Baby-Ionian Captivity, which lasted for about 50 years in the 6th century BC. It would thus be possible that young children taken from Jerusalem earlier in the century would now be old men and women, barely aware of their heritage, having to rebuild their culture and start over. They would know the stories of the "good old days" from their parents, and would have spent their entire lives wondering if they would ever regain that heritage. But now, the captivity over, there would be a new beginning which would be seen as a time of grace from the Lord. While a previous generation went forth weeping, it would be these children of Israel who would return, rejoicing at the new harvest of faith and friendship with the Lord.

Now for some newsy items: First, please note on page 4: thanks to the men's society, this week we **paid the last of our ACSA debt** to the diocese and now are debt free as a parish! Your support of the men's society activities... the pancake and sausage breakfast, the fish fries, and other parish events, have made this possible. Thank you!

Last week we **published our annual financial report** for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024. You may obtain copies of this report in our parish office or you can go to our parish website and select the financial report (as well as prior years' financial reports) from the "Bulletins" page. The current report is sorted among all the documents with last week's date: "2024-1020".

As part of that report, and as a request from me, I am asking our parishioners to consider again their **stewardship tithing to the parish**. A 10% tithe is the biblical ideal, but most of us, myself included, are 'taking steps' year by year to get closer to that ideal. Indeed, because we have been saving money not engaging the services of professional fundraisers, we have not been as consistent with the reminder to our people to periodically re-examine their stewardship giving. This now is your sign and invitation. Certainly, if the current economy or your personal circumstances are too difficult for an increase in giving, you can certainly arrive at that conclusion without moral scruple. However, if due to inflation you have seen raises and cost of living adjustments, I ask you to consider helping your parish church and school in a proportional way. In the financial report, I included a tithing chart to help parishioners consider 'taking a step' towards a biblical tithe for the needs of the Church. I thank you for your careful, even prayerful, consideration of this practice. Here is a copy of the chart included in the financial report:

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines charity, or love, as "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" (CCC, 1823). In the Bible, Jesus even raises love to the level of a new commandment, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12).
