## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Which is the first of the commandments? "Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second is this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There is no greater commandment than these. (Mark 12: 28b-31)

Of all of the great commandments, the love of God comes first. Everything else strengthens that first commitment... Mass on Sunday, commitment to one's vocation, leading a healthy and productive life, developing a life of prayer and a spirit of mindfulness

around God's presence. These many goods present an array of choices and value judgements, some of which are black-and-white-easy based on principles and rules, while others are extraordinarily subjective according to our momentary needs and wants, and the rest lying perhaps somewhere in between.

Indeed, the great choice to be made this week involves our vote in this week's election. As Catholics, we understand that the collective decision to invest the authority to govern in certain leaders must be aligned in our best judgement on those proposals and policies that will promote the 'common good'.

In their document on "Faithful Citizenship", the US Bishops call the common good, "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and easily." This fulfillment is found in being able to live out and enjoy the essential human rights enshrined in our founding documents as a nation: "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." As such, exercising the right and duty to vote is fundamentally a moral act with the responsibilities that come with such an important act. And so, while one single



vote might not be of consequence to the direction of a nation, one's stewardship over that single vote makes a profound statement about how one lives out their Christian vocation. Of first importance is that all of those who are eligible to vote take the time to learn the issues and the candidates' platforms, and then make the effort to actually cast a ballot. From there, further consideration of one's stewardship over their vote includes not only the final result of

one's vote, (which candidate is ultimately selected on the ballot,) but it also includes the process of forming one's conscience with due care and deliberation, by discerning the issues at hand and understanding the needs of our community, and choosing with the greatest good in one's mind and heart. In conscientiously engaging in this exercise, not only are the expectations of religious piety fulfilled, but also those of patriotism.

Much has been said by candidates, leaders of the church, the media, and the critics of each group, but the bottom line is that a choice lies before us. We must make sure that the praise and glory of God comes before all things as we make this choice: above the parties, the candidates, and all other self-interests. In providence, am sure that we will get who we deserve as our elected leaders. May those who win the support of the electorate have the strength to govern well according to what is right and true and just in this world and in the world to come.
