A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



A widow placed a few coins in the temple treasury, which Jesus pointed out to his disciples: Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all that she had, her whole livelihood. (Mark 12: 43-44)

The widow of today's Gospel is not lauded by the percentage of her gift, or by what little was left behind for her own use, but instead for the *spirit* of her generosity. Could such a modest gift ever be of any real help to the temple or its treasury? Probably not. Indeed, one might judge the humble gift as a waste or even a crime against the faith of the old woman. But generosity is a virtue that counteracts selfishness and indifference toward one's neighbor. Generosity transforms the giver. And so, the widow gave not from things external to her, but from the very bread she might have otherwise eaten. This is the spirit which the Gospel of Mark has been encouraging in those who hear the saving words of Jesus... not to be full on the things of this world, but totally reliant on the grace and providence of our Lord.



On Monday of this week, we have the civil observance of Veteran's Day, calling to mind the sacrifices of all of those who have made the effort and sacrifice of wearing the uniform of our nation's military.

On a recent visit to classrooms at St. Dominic, I talked with 5th-8th graders about the Church's tradition known as "Just War Theory". War is never a good thing, even when it serves 'justified' purposes. But there

are circumstances when the Church, in helping to form the consciences of those who fight in war or who are in leadership positions, offers guidelines on how to act honorably and with a degree of restraint consistent with human and Christian dignity. There are times when even Christians cannot stand as absolute pacifists, for sometimes it becomes necessary, even at the cost of offering one's innocent life, to make that sacrifice for others and for society. Evils such as Nazism had to be stopped by any means necessary... certainly peaceful and diplomatic means, if possible, but using warfare if necessary... as a matter of national and international self-defense, for the preservation of life, and the restoration of civil order.

On the night before he died, Jesus gave the command, "Love one another as I have loved you." To this he added, "no greater love has one than to lay down one's life for a friend." (John 15-12, 13) Those who wear the uniform of the Armed Forces of the United States, no matter where or how they serve, they sacrifice personal freedoms and welfare each day: being away from family, undergoing extensive training, pausing careers, education, and investment for personal gain, going to far of lands under the threat of war in less than ideal travel and living arrangements. In the end, all who wear the uniform also implicitly pledge to give their lives for the objectives of their commanders and elected leaders who form and guide policy. Some do make the ultimate sacrifice, but all who honorably wear the uniform are worthy of our respect and thanks, especially on this day, Veterans' Day. We pray that their sacrifices may not have gone in vain, but that their efforts be accepted by Almighty God and a grateful nation as they are laid on an altar of greater peace and justice in our broken world. We further pray that those who receive the benefits of these sacred offerings may always be grateful to our Veterans as they live lives in peace, prosperity, hope, and dignity.

Women's Advent by Candlelight at St. Peter Parish


