#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan: 2024 Year in Review

As a parish family, we have a lot to be thankful for in 2024. Here are just a few of them, in no particular order... "part 2" will be next week!

Quincy Catholic Schools— In 2023, Bishop Paprocki gave permission to form a provisional board of governance for a cooperative school



system among the four Quincy parishes with schools, with the eye to develop the structures and programs necessary to maintain and promote Catholic Education in Quincy well in to the 21st

Century. In April, QCS held a retreat to formulate a Strategic Plan for our proposed school system. In September, a community discussion of a Facilities Plan was held. generating widespread discussion about the merits and challenges of establishing a middle school. These discussions resulted in a mandate to re-work that idea, promising no changes for the 2025-26 school year. Finally in December parish meetings were held to provide additional information to parish and school stakeholders, publishing and explaining some of the the financial realities facing our parishes and schools. These efforts continue, thanks to the work of Dr. Chris Gill and a board of parish and school representatives who continue to meet to explore ways that our community can maintain and promote Catholic Education in Quincy. In 2024, the parish observed the fortieth anniversary of the dedication of St. Anthony of Padua Church. Bishop Paprocki came out to mark

the occasion at Sunday Mass. 2024 also marked the 165th anniversary of the founding of the parish and 2023 the 60th anniversary of St. Dominic School.

We had a special 'summer cohort' to welcome five who were celebrating the Sacraments of Initiation outside of the regular Easter timeline. Now known as the "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults", OCIA will be starting a new round of classes for those interested in becoming Catholic (or simply seeing what we are about) starting in January.

The debt/ accrued deficits box on page 4 of the bulletin disappeared



upon the final payment of backobligations to the Diocese of Springfield. We count on you and thank all who support our parish on a weekly basis, faithfully helping us to fulfill our mission in parish and school ministries!

Communio is coming to town!
Thanks to a grant from the Tracy
Family Foundation, St. Anthony

parish has launched a partnership with Communio, an organization that helps churches to evangelize through of the renewal healthy relationships, marriages, and families. 


A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal
