## March 9, 2025 First Sunday of Lent

### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

On Ash Wednesday, the Church uses in her prayers the idea that Lent is a "campaign", not unlike a soldier preparing for battle or a sports team beginning a competitive season:

Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with the weapons of self-restraint. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with with and the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Lent is the Christian boot camp, the Christian version of spring training. There is a battle against the evil one that lies before us. The power of the cross and its savior



have already determined the outcome of this great conflict, but we want to make sure that all the faithful are ready to do their part and that they are strong enough not to be a 'casualty' to sin. How do we prepare ourselves for the campaign? With the weapons of self-restraint: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the three classic disciplines of the season. In these disciplines, we temper our desires and train our wills, that in denying ourselves small things, we may be strengthened against greater temptations. These disciplines not only build character and strengthen confidence in virtue, but they also inspire gratitude for God's gifts, most notably his mercy. There is a serious focus for the season, but moreso, a call to be 'happy warriors' as we set out on our mission. We live Lent for the love of God, experiencing his grace and mercy, celebrating his victory over sin and death through the resurrection, and ultimately reigning with him forever.

Lenten Regulations: The Season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025 and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 17, 2025, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), in addition to the following minimal Lenten disciplines:

- ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
  - While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts penance as a way to learn and understand the spirit of the Lenten season.
- FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
  - At or over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days. but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.
  - Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes or hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting is not be healthy,) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept, and so it would not be binding.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful. "Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.
