March 30, 2025 Fourth Sunday of Lent

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

My favorite move of all time is the 1984 eight-time Academy Award winning movie, Amadeus, based on a play by Peter Schafer and directed by Milos Forman, starring F. Murray Abraham as Antonio Salieri and Tom Hulce as Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. The movie is an extended flashback on the rivalry (perhaps more a work of dramatic fiction than reality) between Salieri and Mozart, set in the context of Salieri's confession where he accuses himself of Mozart's death.



The film is an unparalleled masterpiece of sight and sound, taking viewers into the 18th century world of opera and royalty, high art and society, creativity and industriousness. It is also a world of faith and doubt, rivalry and pride, poverty and loss. Salieri is portrayed as a self-made man, who despite everything working against him, nonetheless rises to become an influential and accomplished musician and composer in the court of the Holy Roman Emperor, Joseph II of Vienna. While at the top of his powers, a young Mozart suddenly rises on the scene, whose music is instantly recognized by Salieri as something special... filled with such unfulfilled longing as to be from the very 'voice of God'.

A devoted Christian, Salieri turns to God, asking to share Mozart's special gift of music, but feeling ignored—even mocked—by God's grace, he turns against God, pledging that he would do all in his power to destroy the man who carries this divine gift, marking perhaps the most dreadful turn of a character into hellish darkness that would ever be witnessed in film.

Mozart is a prodigiously-gifted musician, but as the movie continues, we find that he is a totally undisciplined man who finds himself on the brink of bankruptcy, divorce, and even death due to his profligate spending, hard drinking, carousing, and overwork. Salieri takes advantage of Mozart's vulnerability by anonymously commissioning a final work from Mozart, a Requiem Mass that would "force God to listen" as Salieri claimed the work as his own, receiving accolades from the public for being as graced in divine music as Mozart was. As the movie continues,



we see how the threat of bankruptcy heightens the stress of trying to complete both the commission for the Requiem (with its promised pay-day) as well as his new opera, The Magic Flute. After the successful premiere of The Magic Flute, we see the famous scene where and exhausted Mozart lying on his death-bed dictates the Confutatis ("...when the cursed are doomed to flames of woe, call me among the blessed...") of the Requiem.

Salieri hadn't needed to plunge a spear into his heart or to strangle him with his bare

hands, but rather the fire of Mozart's genius burnt itself out in this strange, vulgar little man. Years later, Salieri, having lived to see his lifetime of musical output largely forgotten, sits an old man whom God has kept alive... "to torture". The movie ends, with Salieri coming to accept his lot in life, and that reconciliation with God would mean having to recognize himself as the 'patron saint of mediocrities'. The movie ends by Salieri coming to some kind of

resolution from his guilt and proclaiming mercy and deliverance to all those around him who share the burden of mediocrity in the shadow of unattainable greatness.

Amadeus is a powerful study of a soul captured by his own pride and insecurity, a spirit of ingratitude, and a frustration with divine providence. It puts on display the classic understanding of what envy is... not simply the desire for something that belongs to another, but of the hopelessly-dark sadness that comes from jealousy over the blessings bestowed on another that one would wish for himself. As we meditate on the Gospel of the Prodigal Son this weekend, we



see a similar journey, which takes a sinner down a horribly dark path, only to realize that God's mercy is not simply a work of justice, but of complete transformation and regeneration— from being morally and spiritually dead in every sense of the word, turned completely away from the love of the Father, only to find one's way back due to the limitless mercy of the same Father who simply wants to love his son. This is the mercy that awaits all of us poor sinners who turn back to the father with courage, faith, and love.

Eighth Grade Leaders Teach About the Virtue of Fortitude



During the month of March, our eighth-grade leaders have been teaching about the Cardinal Virtue of fortitude. Miss Hope Glidewell, eighth-grade teacher, provides a lesson each day from the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the Bible, or the lives of the Saints. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines fortitude, as "the moral virtue that ensures firmness (courage) in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. The virtue of fortitude enables one to conquer fear, even fear of death, and to face trials and persecutions." (CCC, 1808). In John 16:33, Jesus says, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." The eighth-graders have performed several skits about Saints including St. Maximilian Kolbe and Saint Monica whose lives provide an excellent example of courage and patience in fortitude.
